Philosophy and Mission

At Junction City Middle School Bands we believe that all students deserve the opportunity to have a well-rounded education, and that music is a vital aspect of that experience. Active participation in music-making will encourage students to be more educated citizens and consumers of one of the most important components of our culture - Music.

By <u>Creating</u>, <u>Performing</u>, <u>Responding</u>, and <u>Connecting</u>, students will become well-rounded, educated musicians, and advance to the highest levels of performance and musicality.

Attendance Policy

Attendance is mandatory at all performances - any attendance problems will be dealt with on an individual basis. Any absences from all or part of a rehearsal will require a written excuse from parents or a doctor giving an explanation or reason for the absence. Excuses should be turned in, in advance of the absence when possible. Alternate assignments may be provided to make up the credit, ONLY if the absence is excused. Students with an unexcused absence will a zero in the gradebook for that function/rehearsal. Valid excuses include illness and family emergencies. A calendar of the entire year's band activities will be provided early in the school year so that there is adequate time to plan schedules and resolve conflicts.

Practice Logs

Students will maintain a practice log for every week that will be turned in each Friday. Students will indicate the time spent on individual practice each night for a required, daily average of 20 minutes, six days a week for a total of 120 minutes. Students can receive extra credit for practice beyond 120 minutes. Practice logs will not be accepted without a parent signature.

Grading Policy

All grades will be based on the following criteria; periodic playing tests, quizzes, attitude in rehearsals and at performances, attendance at music functions, homework and other assignments announced by the director.

- □ 20% Practice Logs/Theory/History Written Assignments
- □ 40% Assessments (Playing, Theory, History)
- 40% Concert Participation

Instrument Needs

A supply of school-owned instruments are available for student use at no cost. Keep in mind that most of these instruments are many years old and have been used by many students before - we recommend that after 6th grade, parents rent an instrument for their student. There are many affordable options available through local music stores and online. Beware - If the price of an instrument looks too good to be true, it probably is! You get what you pay for... Please note that purchasing an instrument is a big investment in your student - if you require any assistance in making the right decision for your student, the directors are always a great resource to lead you in the right direction.

Also available are Renting and Rent-to-Own options through local music shops. Instruments need to be properly cleaned and maintained by the students who check them out. Any damages caused by negligence on the part of the student will result in the student being charged for any repairs and maintenance needed to return the instrument to its best working condition. Instrument-specific care and maintenance instructions and resources will be provided to each student at the beginning of the year.

Lockers/Storage

The directors will assign instrument lockers and locks. Lockers must be kept clean and orderly. If misused, the privilege of storing personal items in an instrumental locker may be revoked. Students should have their name and phone number or Junction City Middle School's phone number fastened to the outside and/or inside of their instrument case - luggage tags work great for this. We also recommend keeping a record of the make and serial number of the instrument in the event that it is lost.

Travel Code of Conduct

Students who represent Junction City Middle School on out-of-town trips are expected to maintain very high standards in every respect at all times. They are expected to attend and be on time for all sessions and activities scheduled for them. In the event of overnight trips, they are expected to be in their rooms at the times designated by their sponsors. Each student will be responsible to one or more faculty sponsors who will supervise the activities of the student for the trip. Negligence in attending sessions, in meeting curfew requirements, or in failing to maintain our standards of conduct may make it necessary for the sponsor to send the student home at his/her own expense. Student conduct on school-related trips: Self-discipline is the key element for a pleasant experience for both the sponsor and the student when the student is on a school-related trip. Students who are involved in a serious disciplinary offense on a school-related trip will face disciplinary action which may include one or more of the following:

Students' attire during school activities outside the school day should be in good taste. If there is any question of taste, the director's decision is final.

All adults on trips serve as sponsors. Students will be expected to treat them with respect at all times. In the event a parent sponsor gives needed supervision, band students must honor that with utmost respect.

GENERAL - Even though you will not always have a band shirt on, people will find out where you are from. You have the opportunity to make a tremendous name for Junction City, USD 475, Junction City Middle School, and for yourself. Be courteous and polite at all times. There is no way we can anticipate every possible scenario, so we ask for good judgement. Please use common sense.

RULE OF THUMB - If there is any question in your mind as to whether you should do something or not - <u>Don't Do It!</u> It is better to be safe than sorry. We are confident that there will be no problems. If we anticipated a problem, we would not travel.

Students wishing to arrive or leave an out-of-town event with their parents must notify the directors in writing with a parent signature prior to the event. Permission will be granted or denied based on the circumstances of the occasion.

Private Lessons

Students are encouraged, but not required, to participate in private lessons. While the JCMS Band instructors have an extensive knowledge and expertise to take students to a proficient level on their instrument, nothing can replace the individual attention and instruction achieved by studying with a person who is considered a professional on their instrument. If your student is interested in taking private lessons, contact the directors, who can assist in finding a private instructor for your student. Lessons are scheduled on a weekly or bi-weekly basis. Prices for private instruction will vary depending on the instructor and the length of the lessons, usually 20-30 minutes.

Finances

It is the philosophy of JCMS Bands that no students should be denied the experience to participate in music due to financial hardships. For options in meeting financial obligations, parents should contact the directors.

Communication

All students should sign up for their respective grade's Remind group. The Remind App allows the directors to instantly message all students with JCMS Bands announcements and reminders of upcoming events and assignments. All students under 13 years of age will be required to provide a parent or guardian email address. The parent or guardian can then sign up to receive all messages that the students receive, as well as reply directly to the directors - students will not have this capability. Instructions to join Remind will be provided during the first week of the school year. In addition to Remind, we can always be reached at the following email addresses:
